

With Mount Fuji as its spectacular backdrop, Japan's capital city successfully mixes ancient tradition and the ultra-modern into one bustling, remarkable metropolis. Full of culture, commerce and people, Tokyo also contains some of the world's most stunning architecture.

Tokyo Tower

Built in prefabricated steel and reaching a height of 1,092 ft. (333m), this iconic structure has been one of the city's most popular attractions since its completion in 1958. As well as transmitting Tokyo's TV and radio stations signals, instruments at the top of the tower also monitor air conditions above the crowded city.





Mode Gakuen Cocoon Tower

Located in the Nishi-Shinjuku high-rise district, this 669 ft. (204 m) tall building is home to three colleges and over 10,000 students. Its distinctive curved shape, dark blue glass and crisscrossed web of white diagonal lines creates a nurturing environment for the students studying inside.

Chidorigafuchi Park

The park is a narrow path that runs alongside the moat of the city's Imperial Palace. Many locals and tourists flock to the area in early Spring to witness the spectacular cherry blossoms during the brief hanami or flower viewing season.

TOKYO SKYTREE

TOKYO SKYTREE is the new symbol of the city of Tokyo. Though ultra-modern in both its appearance and construction, the architecture of TOKYO SKYTREE is similar to the classical design of the traditional 5-story Japanese pagoda. Opened to the public in May 2012, TOKYO SKYTREE is the tallest free-standing tower in the world, rising 2,080 ft. (634m)





Shibuya Crossing




This iconic crossing at the heart of the Shibuya shopping district is the busiest in Japan (and possibly the world). At peak times up to 3000 people will cross the intersection, coming from several directions at once. In the evening, the area comes alive with the colorful lights of the neon signs and jumbo screens.

Tokyo Big Sight



Overlooking Tokyo Bay and officially known as the Tokyo International Exhibition Center, Tokyo Big Sight attracts over 16 million visitors each year. Its most striking feature is the 190 ft. (58m) tall glass and titanium conference tower shaped like an inverted pyramid.
